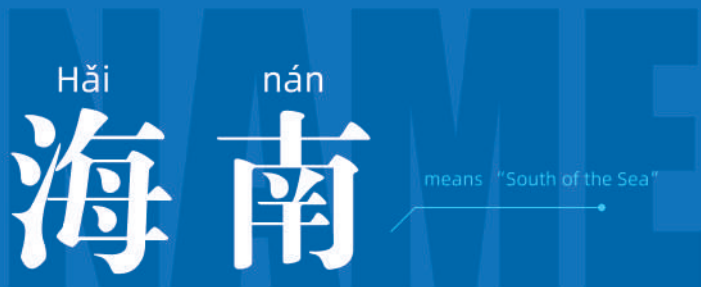

RESIDENCE REGISTRATION

You must register your accommodation with the local police within 24 hours of arriving in Hainan.

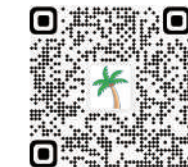


Registering Your Accommodation

If you are staying in a hotel (hostel, short-term rental, or guesthouse), the staff who check you in will do this for you. If you are staying at a private residence, including your own, you or your host must complete residence registration yourselves. You can do this online or in person. Scan the QR code to learn how.

RESIDENCE PERMITS AND VISAS

Foreigners who enter Hainan and need to reside or remain in the country for reasons other than diplomatic or official purposes shall file an application at the exit and entry departments of public security organs for the issuance, extension, change and re-issuance of a residence permit, visa, or stay permit. WORK PERMITS

You need to obtain a work permit and a work-type residence permit to work legally in China. Typically, your Chinese employer will help you to apply for both. Scan the QR code to learn more.

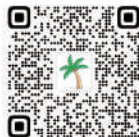

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Almost every restaurant, café, supermarket, mall, hotel, bus, and hospital accept electronic payments. If you don't have a Chinese bank account, you can add your overseas bank card to Alipay or WeChat Pay, China's two most popular e-payment applications. Other payment options are available. Scan the QR code to learn about payment options and Sanya TrustPay.



WECHAT PAY

WeChat Pay by Tencent accepts international bank cards from major card networks, including Visa, Discover Global Network (including Diners Club), JCB, and Mastercard.

ALIPAY

Alipay is an e-wallet service provider similar to PayPal. It accepts international bank cards from major card networks, including Visa, Mastercard, Discover Global Network (including Diners Club), and JCB.

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

If you intend to work or study in Hainan, opening a local bank account is essential. Different banks may have different requirements for opening an account. Two things that are always required are your passport and a mobile number (Chinese or international).

SENDING AND EXCHANGING MONEY

You can send money overseas at banks or through SkyRemit. SkyRemit provides a convenient online remittance services via their WeChat official account. Search "SkyRemit" in WeChat to find out more. You can exchange money at banks and bureaux de change across Hainan. Scan the QR code to see where.

Choose a service provider and head to their local official outlet with your passport or foreign permanent resident ID card to get a SIM card. You can also get a SIM card online at Nihao Mobile. Nihao Mobile offers English service, fast delivery, and supports multiple payment options.

Losing your mobile phone

Call your telecom service provider and report the loss. If you use online banking and WeChat Pay/Alipay, go to your local bank branch and freeze your online banking. Freeze your WeChat Pay and Alipay, and change the passwords on all your social media accounts.

Broadband

You can set up broadband at any official outlet of the major telecom service providers listed above (subject to coverage in your local community) with your passport/permanent resident ID card and address. Many broadband packages come with free SIM cards linked to your name with phone numbers that can be used when opening bank accounts and registering for various services.

GETTING AROUND



Hainan is a well-connected place, with three international airports, ferry terminals, a round-island high-speed railway, several expressways, and frequent urban and inter-city bus services. It is easy to rent a car, hail a taxi, or order a ride-hailing car via mobile apps. Shared bikes can be found along almost every street in cities.

The Hainan Round-Island High-Speed Railway links all of Hainan's main coastal cities and counties and provides connections to its three international airports.

Hainan also has rail connections to many destinations throughout the Chinese mainland via the train ferry.

Ticket purchasing channels:

Tickets can be purchased via the 12306 China Railway website/app or hotline (12306), Qunar, Ctrip, or in person at a manned train station ticket office. Before buying tickets via the official 12306 platform, you need to complete real-name verification. Scan the QR code to learn how.

Ferry



Three main ferry terminals connect Hainan to the Chinese mainland, all located in Haikou.

- Xinhai Harbour
- Xiuying Harbour
- Nangang Harbour

These ferry terminals serve both passengers and vehicles, while Nangang also provides ferry services for trains between Hainan and the mainland. It takes 70-100 minutes to cross the Qiongzhou Strait by ferry to Xuwen County in Guangdong. Ferry services are suspended during poor weather conditions (typhoons, high winds, fog). You can purchase passenger tickets and vehicle tickets in person at the terminals or online via the "Qiongzhou Strait Ferry Service" (琼州海峡轮渡管家) WeChat public account (for Xinhai and Xiuying) or the "Hainan Rail Ferry" (海南铁路轮渡) WeChat mini-program (for Nangang). Bus



All cities and counties in Hainan have scheduled local bus routes.

There are also plenty of intercity bus routes linking cities and counties across Hainan, as well as inter-provincial bus services in Haikou.

Of course, taxis can still be hailed from the roadside. Few taxi drivers speak English. If you don’t speak Chinese, show the driver your destination in Chinese. Scan the QR code to check fares.

Shared Bikes



Renting a Shared Bike

Shared bikes are a great way to get around in urban areas. The two main choices are yellow bikes by Meituan and blue bikes by Hellobike from Alibaba. Scan the QR code to learn how to rent a shared bike.

E-Bikes



Registering Your E-bike

If you plan to stay in Hainan longer, consider getting an e-bike, ideally from an authorized dealer. You must register your e-bike and get a license plate. Scan the QR code to learn how.

Cars



Applying for a Provisional Driver's Permit

If you have an overseas driver’s license and you’re staying in Hainan for a short period, you can apply for a provisional driver’s permit without taking an exam and then rent a car. Scan the QR code to learn how.



Getting a Full Chinese Driver's License

If you plan to stay longer, you can take China’s driving theory exam (multiple languages available) to obtain a full Chinese driver’s license. With it, you can either rent or buy a car. Scan the QR code to learn more.



Drunk Driving

Do not drive under the influence in China; the penalties for doing so are severe.



Penalty Points and Traffic Infractions

China institutes a penalty point system for drivers. If you accrue 12 or more points within a 12-month period, your license will be suspended. Make sure to follow the rules of the road and drive safe!

HOUSING



People usually rely on real estate agents to find housing. You can find an agency in or near the residential community you are interested in. It is important to carefully review the lease and thoroughly check the property before signing a contract.

RENTING

When signing a lease, remember to bring your passport and residence permit/visa (or foreign permanent resident ID card). Ensure your name and ID certificate number written on the lease match those on your ID certificate. After signing the lease, remember to head to the local police station within 24 hours to register your new accommodation.

Costs involved in renting a property

Rent	Paid in advance monthly or every three/six/twelve months. Negotiate payment schedule with property owner.
Deposit	Returned after tenancy ends. Usually equal to 1 or 2 months' rent.
Management Fee	For maintenance of communal areas. Paid monthly. May include communal electricity charge.
Commission	Paid to real estate agency. Usually equal to half a month's rent.
Utilities	Usually paid monthly by tenant.

DAILY NECESSITIES



Paying Your Utility Bills via WeChat or Alipay

UTILITY BILLS

You can pay your bills in multiple ways. You can visit a post office, certain convenience stores, banks, or utility company offices to pay in person. The easiest way to pay your bill is online using e-payment platforms like WeChat Pay or Alipay. In certain communities in Hainan, the property management company will have pre-paid accounts for your property that must be topped up in order to use utilities such as electricity, water, and gas. WI-FI

Free Wi-Fi is available in most public places such as train stations, airports, coffee shops, restaurants, and convenience stores. If you can't see the Wi-Fi password displayed anywhere, you can get it by asking staff:

Wi-Fi密码是什么? (Wi-Fi mímǎ shì shén me?)



DOMESTIC HELPERS (AYI)

Employing a domestic helper (ayi) can help make life much easier. They offer services ranging from weekly cleans to full-service cleaning, cooking, and childcare. Ask your property management company, neighbors, or friends for recommendations.

DELIVERY SERVICES



Various companies provide courier services, ranging from local direct delivery to international shipping. You must present your passport/foreign permanent resident ID card when sending items via courier or through the mail in China.

EDUCATION



Education in Hainan

The education system in Hainan consists primarily of public schools, with a number of private bilingual schools as well as a few international schools for the children of expats. Scan the QR code to learn more about education options.

MEDICAL CARE

SOCIAL AND HEALTH INSURANCE

By law, expats working in Hainan should be covered by social insurance, which includes pension, medical insurance, employment injury insurance, unemployment insurance, and maternity insurance. Expats holding permanent resident ID cards may enrol for basic medical insurance for urban and rural residents as required. The unemployed spouses & immediate family members of high-end foreign talents and the domestic helpers employed by them may enrol for basic medical insurance for urban employees or basic medical insurance for urban and rural residents.

HOSPITALS

All hospitals in Hainan are open to any person, foreign or Chinese, who needs medical treatment.



List of Hospitals with International Clinics in Hainan.



A total of 26 hospitals in Hainan have international clinics providing outpatient services in English. Please note that fees for these services are higher than regular fees in other parts of the hospital and treatment is not covered by social insurance. You can still claim against your private health insurance. Scan the QR code to see a full list.

For emergency care, proceed to any public hospital with an emergency room (急诊). Have a Chinese-speaking friend, relative, or colleague accompany you. Scan the QR code to learn how to seek treatment at a hospital in Hainan.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

China has emergency numbers assigned for specific purposes. Calls to these numbers are free and can be connected via any available mobile network.



119 – Fire and rescue



120 – Ambulance and paramedic service. Call when you or someone else need emergency medical care but cannot go to the hospital on your own.



110 – Police. Call when you need to report a crime or seek help from the police in an emergency.



122 – Traffic accident reporting

Foreign-language service may not be available when calling these numbers. If you don't speak Chinese, have a Chinese-speaking friend, relative, neighbor, or colleague call on your behalf.

CLIMATE AND TEMPERATURE

Hainan has a tropical monsoon marine climate with dry winters.



- Wet and dry seasons
- Generous sunshine
- Abundant rainfall
- Narrow average annual temperature range (22-26°C)
- Day and night lengths do not vary much throughout the year

TYPHOONS



The eastern coast of Hainan lies in the path of typhoons, which occur between May and November. Typhoons bring strong winds, heavy rains, and sudden temperature drops. Transportation and schools may be affected.

FOG AND HUMIDITY



In January and February, the coastal areas of Hainan, particularly in the north of the island, are often affected by thick fog caused by cold winter fronts to the north coming into contact with the warmer sea fronts. It may be difficult to dry clothes, and moisture condensing on interior walls may lead to mold. Reduce humidity by keeping your windows closed and using the dehumidifying function on your air conditioner. Consider buying a standalone dehumidifier.

SUNSHINE



Due to Hainan's low latitude, sunshine tends to be very intense on clear days. Remember to use sunscreen and umbrellas to prevent sunburn.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS AND TRADITIONAL FESTIVALS

Four major traditional festivals that are celebrated across China are also designated public holidays: the Spring Festival, Qingming Festival, Dragon Boat Festival, and Mid-Autumn Festival.

STATUTORY PUBLIC HOLIDAYS IN CHINA

- New Year's Day - January 1 (1 day)
- Spring Festival - The 1st to 3rd days of the 1st lunar month (3 days)
- Qingming Festival - Around April 5 (1 day)
- Labor Day - May 1 (1 day)
- Dragon Boat Festival - 5th day of the 5th lunar month (1 day)
- Mid-Autumn Festival - 15th day of the 8th lunar month (1 day)
- National Day Holiday - October 1 to 3 (3 days)



Most employers will combine statutory public holidays with weekends or extra days to give their employees some more time off. Those extra days off that fall on weekdays sometimes need to be made up by working on weekends preceding or following the holiday. This is called 调休 (tiáo xiū) in Chinese.

Hainan has two major local festivals, Sanyuesan and Junpo (or Gongqi).

The Sanyuesan festival, which falls on the 3rd day of the 3rd month of the lunar calendar, is a traditional festival of the Li and Miao ethnic groups. It is considered their "Valentine's Day", when courtship was traditionally initiated.

Junpo, or Gongqi, is celebrated at different times in different villages in Hainan. It is a time of making offerings to ancestors and historical figures, particularly Lady Xian (冼夫人).

OFFSHORE DUTY-FREE PURCHASE RULES

- Annual purchase limit of 100,000 yuan per person
- You can make as many trips as you like to Hainan, but frequent, short visits involving purchases of large quantities of duty-free goods may arouse suspicion as to whether they are for personal use.
- Per-trip limits on purchase quantities (Cosmetics: 30 items, mobile phones: 4 devices, spirits: no more than 1,500 ml)
- You must present your valid ID (passport/permanent resident ID card) and ticket for your flight/train/ferry departing Hainan.

Only passengers departing Hainan for destinations on the Chinese mainland may purchase offshore duty-free goods. Passengers departing on international flights may purchase duty-free goods in the international departure lounge at the airport.



EVERYDAY SHOPPING

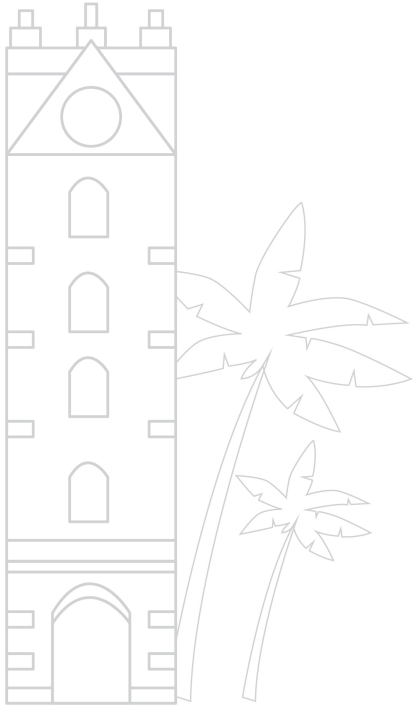

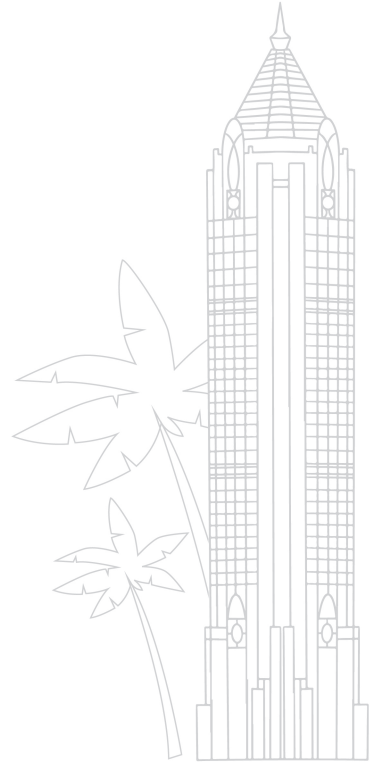

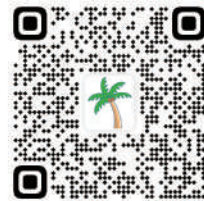
